Premier League

Manly United 2
Bankstown Lions 2

Both Bankstown City and Manly United shared the points in what was a pretty entertaining match at Jensen Park as the game ended 2-2 last Sunday afternoon.

Former NSW Premier League leaders Bankstown went into the match minus two of its stars in Nahuel Arrarte and Robbie Mileski who were both given time off following ugly scenes that occurred in their clash against Wollongong Wolves two weeks ago.

Nevertheless it was a pretty action packed first half as the home side got off to a bright start when Shane Webb's cross nearly caught out Manly keeper Brad Swancott who tipped the ball over the bar in the third minute.

Manly's first real chance came in the sixteenth minute when Robbie Cattanach had his shot blocked by Bankstown keeper Cem Akilli as the pair went into a fifty-fifty challenge inside the six-yard box.

Bankstown striker Tallan Martin was next to test Swancott as he had his fierce shot from outside the Manly United box saved by Manly's number one in the twentieth minute.

Manly almost caught the home side napping after a sloppy pass by Richard Luksic inside his own box gifted Ashley Ryan the ball, but his follow-up shot deflected wide for a corner in the twenty-first minute.

With numerous chances falling for both sides, it was the home team that took the lead in the thirty-eighth minute after youngster Samuel Mort played a delightful ball to Martin who finished off superbly with a venomous left-foot strike.

Manly almost pulled a goal back in the last two minutes of the first half as Cattanach and James Monie had chances to notch one for the away side.

The second half saw more of an open match and it was Manly that took the initiative after a gift of a goal in the fifty-second minute courtesy of a ghastly mistake by Akilli.

The Bankstown keeper ran out to punch a high ball just outside his box but miss-judged it as it fell on the head of Monie, who nodded home his side's much needed equaliser.

Things went from bad to worse for the home side as Manly scored a second in the sixtieth minute thanks to a deflected goal.

Bradley Groves' driving free-kick from 30-yards took a wicked deflection off Ashley Ryan in the box which deceived Akilli and put Manly in the lead. The home side lifted up a notch and got their just reward in the sixty-eighth minute when Martin was upended in the box by Manly United defender Beau Busch.

Up stepped Martin who smashed home his sixth goal of the season and gave Bankstown a chance to secure three points.

Celebrations were short-lived though as in the seventy-sixth minute, Bankstown were down to ten-men after Brett Studman was sent off for a second caution.

Referee Jonathon Streater was rather harsh on Studman's second caution as the defender clearly protected his face but the whistleblower believed it was an intentional handball.

Nonetheless the home side played better with ten-men and almost snatched the victory in the dying stages of the match as Martin, who could have scored a few, saw his volley inside the box, sail over the bar.

Despite surrendering a lead, Moss said he was pleased with the draw and believes his team has turned the corner after two straight defeats.

"It's (Bankstown) a very hard place to come especially when you go a goal down," Moss said.

"To come back and take the lead showed a lot of character. I thought our passing and commitment was a lot better."

Manly have moved up to fifth position with Sunday's draw, two points outside the top four.

In the early game the under-20s fell to a disappointing 3-0 defeat. United are back at Cromer Park next Sunday for a crucial game against Wollongong.

Socceroos v Argentina rescheduled Australia's 2007 Asian Cup draw

Football Federation Australia has announced that it had agreed to the Argentinean Football Association's request to re-schedule the international match with the Qantas Socceroos which had been confirmed for the MCG on 6 June.

Argentina made the request due to concerns that as a result of other match commitments in Europe (made subsequent to their committing to the match in Australia) they would be unable to bring their top players nor have sufficient preparation for the match on June 6. FFA is committed to hosting only a full strength Argentina team in Melbourne.

"We have been in discussions with the Argentinean Football Association President Mr. Julio Grondona and we agreed it would be in the best interests of both teams and Australian football supporters to postpone the match to later this year and we expect to confirm the new match date within the next week or so," said FFA CEO Mr. Ben Buckley.

"We share our fans disappointment about re-scheduling the match, but we hope that they will accept that a postponement was necessary so that we will see a full strength Argentina."

"Representatives from the FFA will be meeting with officials from the AFA and their match agents early next week to finalise the revised match date."

FFA advises fans who have already purchased tickets to retain them as they will be valid for the re-scheduled date. Refunds will also be available for those who are unable to attend and refund arrangements will be announced once the re-scheduled match date is confirmed.

"At this stage it appears unlikely that we will have another match in Australia in June which means that

the World Cup qualifying re-match against Uruguay at Telstra Stadium on 2 June will be the only chance to farewell the team ahead of the Asian Cup," added Mr Buckley.

Five signed by Phoenix

New A-League club Wellington Phoenix announced on Tuesday its first five signings - two current New Zealand internationals and three Australians.

Heading the list is former Adelaide United captain Ross Aloisi, the 34-year-old signing with Phoenix for one year.

Joining Aloisi in the midfield will be New Zealander Tim Brown and Australians Richard Johnson and Michael Ferrante, with current New Zealand goalkeeper Mark Paston also signing on.

Brown, Paston and Ferrante have signed two-year deals, with Johnson signing for one year.

Aloisi was captain of Adelaide United for the inaugural season of the A-League, leading his side to the premiership. He also captained Adelaide to the A-League 2007 Grand Final against Melbourne Victory.

Phoenix coach Ricki Herbert said Aloisi would be invaluable to the club.

"Ross brings a wealth of experience and knowledge, as evident in his captaincy at Adelaide. His contribution to that club is shown in the fact that Adelaide has been the most consistent club in the competition in the past two years."

Herbert said the signings of current New Zealand internationals Paston, 30, and Brown, 26, reflected his and Phoenix owner Terry Serepisos' desire to have a strong New Zealand presence at the club.

Paston played for the New Zealand Knights last season and Brown the Newcastle Jets.

For Brown the return is a homecoming, having been born in Wellington and played for local club Miramar Rangers before heading overseas.

"It speaks volumes that Tim wants to be a Phoenix player," Herbert said.

"During the latter part of last season Tim was an integral part of the Newcastle Jets' midfield through the finals series. From a performance point of view he's played at that high level which will be important.

"Mark (Paston) is the national team goalkeeper. His presence and performances at the back end of last year's A-League for the Knights were quite outstanding," Herbert said.

Ferrante, 26, made five appearances for grand final winners Melbourne Victory last season.

Herbert said the opportunity for more game time with Phoenix was an incentive for Ferrante to sign.

"He's a different type of midfielder - a good technician," Herbert said.

"Having been in a very successful club (Melbourne Victory), he will be looking to set a benchmark for himself with regular appearances for Phoenix. Michael's very keen to make an impression."

Johnson, 33, has played 35 A-League matches with the Jets and Knights, as well as 242 appearances for English club Watford between 1991-2003.

"During my time with Richard at the Knights his work ethic was unquestioned," Herbert said.

"He's another signing from an experience point of view that will add strength and steel to the middle of the park."

Herbert said the release of the first signings was just reward for the hard work that had gone into ensuring the club got up to speed as quickly as possible ahead of its opening A-League match against Melbourne Victory in Wellington on August 26.

"The process of identifying and recruiting players has been quite exhaustive over the past four to six weeks," Herbert said.

"It's nice to be able to bring an initial group to its conclusion at Phoenix. More signings will be released in the coming days."

Liverpool wins on penalties

Dirk Kuyt has put Liverpool into their second UEFA Champions League final inside three years by scoring the winning penalty against Chelsea at Anfield.

With the scores level on aggregate at 1-1 after extra-time, Bolo Zenden, Xabi Alonso, Steven Gerrard and Dirk Kuyt all scored from the spot while Arjen Robben and Geremi saw their efforts saved by Jose Reina.

Defender Daniel Agger had levelled the tie at 1-1 by stroking home Gerrard's 22nd-minute free-kick.

Anfield was the expected cauldron of anticipation and it was no surprise when Liverpool enjoyed the first effort on goal in the fifth minute when captain Gerrard let fly from 25 yards.

However, the England midfielder failed to trouble Petr Cech as his shot drifted past an upright.

Liverpool were clearly intent on levelling the aggregate scores as quickly as possible but while they began to stretch Chelsea's defence, their final ball left a lot to be desired.

In the 10th minute John Arne Riise delivered a superb cross from the left wing only for it fly harmlessly across the face of the Chelsea six-yard box.

In the 14th minute Frank Lampard set Didier Drogba clear of the home defence but the Ivorian's attempted cross to Salomon Kalou was easily dealt with by Agger.

Chelsea were beginning to live dangerously and both John Mikel Obi and Joe Cole were lucky to escape without a booking for fouls on Zenden and Gerrard.

The champions paid dearly for Cole's misdemeanour in the 22nd minute when Agger swept home Gerrard's free-kick to give the home side the lead on the night and put them level overall.

The second half began with Liverpool attempting to put more pressure on the visitors but Dirk Kuyt was unceremoniously dumped on the floor by Paulo Ferreira when he tried to make progress down the left.

Moments later Gerrard found his way blocked by Ashley Cole as he attempted to work his way into the penalty area.

Chelsea had resisted the temptation to make any changes in the interval and were beginning to enjoy more possession.

Joe Cole just overran the ball when he tried to take on the Liverpool defence and Reina went down to collect before the England international could move into a shooting position.

In the 54th minute Chelsea won a free-kick on the right wing but Lampard's punt into the area sailed over everyone.

In the 56th minute Chelsea had Cech to thank when he pulled off a superb save at the far post.

Pennant turned Claude Makelele inside out before crossing to the far post where England striker Peter Crouch's downward header was saved by Cech's legs.

Moments later Kuyt hit the crossbar with a powerful header as Liverpool increased the pressure on the Londoners.

In the 61st minute Agger was booked for one foul too many on Drogba, who was left writhing on the deck after a challenge from behind.

A goal for Chelsea would give Liverpool a mountain to climb but the champions were more content to knock the ball around than to try and hurt Liverpool.

But a poor pass from Makelele left Essien with no choice but to foul Crouch and give Liverpool another opportunity in the 69th minute.

Once again Crouch was the target and his header was cleared for a corner by the grateful Essien.

When Pennant swung the ball into the middle it was Drogba who found the height to clear the danger.

In the 75th minute Chelsea should have equalised when Ashley Cole got clear on the left flank and crossed into the six-yard box where Drogba somehow managed to send the ball over the crossbar.

With the aggregate scores locked at 1-1, the match went into extra-time.

In the 97th minute Mourinho made his first change of the night when he replaced Joe Cole with Dutch winger Arjen Robben.

Three minutes later Kuyt was adjudged offside when he converted the rebound after Cech had failed to hold a ferocious drive from Xabi Alonso.

Five minutes before the end of extra-time Drogba just failed to connect with a low cross from Shaun Wright-Phillips but Cech rescued Chelsea when he punched away Kuyt's shot moments later.

And the game went to penalties with Liverpool keeper Reina the hero as he saved two penalties.

Kewell returns in style

Harry Kewell made an impressive return from injury when he created a goal during Liverpool Reserves' 3-1 win over Everton at Wrexham's Racecourse Ground.

The Reds number seven hadn't kicked a ball since scoring for Australia against Croatia in the 2006 World Cup and has been on the sidelines all season.

Kewell made an instant impact after being introduced to the game on 55 minutes. He was only on the field for five minutes when he beat two defenders down the left and set up Craig Lindfield for a tap-in from close range.

Kewell's return will be welcome news for Liverpool manager Rafael Benitez and Socceroos boss Graham Arnold, who will fly to England this week to discuss the availability of players for July's Asian Cup.



Arnold has planned a series of meetings with domestic club managers across Europe, including Everton's David Moyes, Middlesbrough's Gareth Southgate, Liverpool's Rafa Benitez and Blackburn chief Mark Hughes.

Liverpool's Kewell, Everton's Tim Cahill, Middlesbrough trio Mark Viduka, Mark Schwarzer and Brad Jones, and Blackburn's Brett Emerton top Arnold's list of high-profile players.

Australia will make their Asian Cup debut after switching to Asian Football Confederation from the Oceania Football Confederation at the start of the 2006.

"All the players are dead keen and up for the Asian Cup but it's about communicating that with the managers," Arnold told the *Daily Telegraph*.

"We need to communicate what the Asian Cup's about because this is not only new to us but new to all our players and their clubs and the players will be missing from their clubs for six weeks during a crucial part of the pre-season.

"We'll detail our training program so hopefully they'll be happy and relaxed that the players return fit and ready for the start of the season.

"It's something we've wanted to do for a while and it's important to start building relationships with the managers because we may need to talk in future about releasing them for World Cup qualifiers."

Arnold will also fly to Germany and Switzerland after several days in England to meet with Nurnberg manager Hans Meyer and FC Basel supremo Christian Gross.

Arnold is confident of securing the services of the majority of his squad despite fitness concerns over World Cup stars Kewell, Cahill, Craig Moore and Josh Kennedy.

"There may be a few hiccups but I'm positive we can get most of the squad," he added.

"There could be a few players that have an off-season transfer but, even if they do, they have indicated that they want to come.

"One thing I can't foresee is transfers, and those discussions may come at a later date, but from the players' point of view it's quite positive.

"This is an extremely motivated group. They've never won anything as a nation at any level and they want to go to the Asian Cup and do well.

"At this moment we have four injury concerns with Tim, Harry, Moorey and Josh - they've either had limited playing time or been out for extended periods so we'll see how they go in the next few weeks."

Bresciano and Grella win

Socceroos midfielder Mark Bresciano has made a crucial goalline clearance to help Palermo to a 2-1 victory at Livorno in Italy's Serie A.

David Di Michele struck the winning goal to hand Renzo Gobbo a dream start as caretaker manager after the sacking of Francesco Guidolin and give the Sicilian club its first win since February 2.

The hosts narrowly missed a chance to take the lead after 28 minutes when Fabio Galante's header rebounded off the far post, forcing Bresciano to clear the ball off the line.

Palermo captain Eugenio Corini put the visitors in front from the penalty spot in the 48th minute after Emanuele Manitta had brought down Di Michele inside the area.

But his team's joy was short-lived as Aparecido Cesar equalised for Livorno 10 minutes later, again from the penalty spot after Roberto Guana held Stefano Morrone inside the area.

Di Michele latched onto a cross from Corini and found the net to seal victory in the 75th minute.

Bresciano was replaced by Edison Cavani after 61 minutes.

Palermo climbed to fifth place with the win, two points clear of Fiorentina with four games remaining.

Meanwhile, Vince Grella came off the bench for Parma, who put three points between themselves and the relegation zone with a 2-1 over fellow strugglers Cagliari.

Igor Budan's first-half goal was cancelled out by Daniele Conti midway through the second, before Andrea Gasbarroni secured the result in the home team's favour from the penalty spot in the 77th minute.

Grella, who has recently been troubled by knee and hamstring injuries, came on for Luca Cigarini with about 10 minutes remaining in the match.
