Manly United 1

Penrith Nepean United 0

Manly United defeated a valiant Penrith Nepean United side 1-0 in Sunday's NSW Premier League match at Cromer Park. A late Robbie Cattanaach goal was enough to separate the sides in a fiercely contested match that belied the difference between the two sides on the table.

Early on the visitors played with a lot of commitment and it looked as if an upset could be on the cards. The team's goal scoring problems were almost solved by Roberto Hamad of the Manly side as he tried to clear a free kick from Penrith away but only managed to lob it towards his own goal. Brad Swancott was alert enough to touch the ball over the bar.

Five minutes later and it was the other custodian pulling off the heroics as Fernando Greco touched over the bar a Bradley Groves chip shot. A minute later it was the visitors turning on the style as Angelo Petratos touched the ball to Erick Anabalon on the edge of the area and the skilful Anabalon controlled the ball with one touch and fired past the Manly keeper only to see it come crashing off the crossbar.

On the half hour the momentum changed and Manly gained the upper hand in the fierce battle for the middle of the park. In the 32nd minute Cattanaach played the ball around the defence to Michael Williams who had plenty of time free in the area but was shut down by Greco. Then both Brad Groves and Jonty Richter had good chances spurned by the visiting defence shutting them down after they ignored the chance to have an early shot.

In the opening minute of the second half Mitchell Long made a good run down the left and then played it to Anabalon in the area who put in a cross to the far side. Petratos headed the cross back towards the goal but it went over the top of the bar much to the chagrin of the away supporters. After that early chance Manly took the game by the scruff of the net. They had chance after chance in the second half but a combination of poor shooting, good defending and strong goal keeping by Greco seemed to indicate the match could end in a draw.

However Manly did not give up. In the 83rd minute Michael Cunico played the ball through to substitute Andrew Mailer, who was free on the left, but he fired the volley wide of the near post. Then five minutes later Cattanaach attempted to cut the ball back across the face of the visitor's goal with four Manly players lining up to score. From nowhere Danny Wells demonstrated his brilliant ability to read the play and cut out the pass. However a few seconds later the ball fell to James Monie on the left and he cut the ball back to Cattanaach, free in the area, and he slotted the ball home for Manly fans to finally celebrate.

It was not quite over though as Brad Boardman went down the other end and just missed a header that would have put his side back on equal terms. Then both Monie and Michael Lloyd-Green had great chances to put the icing on the cake but a poor final shot and great goalkeeping combined to keep Manly to one goal on the day.

After the match Phil Moss was pleased his side got the result. "Penrith Nepean played very well today and this was a match that concerned me. We had to

grind out a result and to be in the top four you have to win ugly sometimes. We are pleased to come away with the points after Penrith Nepean came to play today."

For Abbas Saad it was a case of looking towards the future. "We played much better today although we did not take our chances. We still need to work on our fitness more but overall I can't complain about the boys effort out there today."

Grounds good for ducks but not so for football

THE torrential rain that lashed the peninsula late last week has played havoc with the local football competitions with the entire Easter Saturday's round postponed. All Manly Warringah Football Association games failed to go ahead on Saturday as the district's 200-plus ovals were soaked by the deluge.

Manly United's NSW Refund Premier Youth League round six matches against Dulwich Hill at Cromer Park also fell victim to the big wet.

The rain subsided on Sunday allowing women's competitions to go ahead as planned as well as another round of Youth League at Cromer.

MWFA president Ray Fanning said it was unfortunate to lose the entire Saturday round but said spare days were in place to catch up those matches.

"All competitions with 12 teams will have a catch-up round on the Monday of the Queen's Birthday long weekend," Fanning confirmed last night.

"The other six-team, eight-team and 10-team competitions also have spare wet weather weekends"

"It will all be confirmed when the draw comes out later this week"

Fanning also said that both the Premier League and Amateur League Division One competitions would have a full round on Anzac Day. "We need to fit in as many games as possible just in case of having washouts later in the year," he said.

With more than 16,500 players registered to play football this year, Fanning said MWFA was still suffering from a chronic shortage of grounds.

He said the shortage may force some men's games to be switched from a Saturday to a Sunday afternoon.

"It may happen a couple of times a year in the lower divisions," Fanning said.

"We are really struggling for grounds."

Despite the ground shortage, ladies' matches were in full swing across the peninsula with games held at Grahams Reserve, Millers Reserve, David Thomas, and Dee Why Oval.



Matildas squad hit by injury ahead of Olympic qualifier in Chinese Taipei

The Matildas squad has been hit by injury ahead of Sunday's Beijing Olympic qualifier against Chinese Taipei with striker Jenna Tristram and midfielder Danielle Small forced to withdraw from the 18-strong touring party.

Coffs Harbour local Tristram injured her knee at training the day after last Saturday's match against Hong Kong and scans yesterday revealed a torn anterior cruciate ligament ruling the 20-year-old out of contention for September's FIFA Women's World Cup in China.

Sydney-based Small is also suffering from a knee injury though less serious with the veteran of 38-appearances for Australia set to be available for June's crucial home and away qualifying matches against DPR (North) Korea. Both players featured as substitutes in Saturday's 15-0 rout of Hong Kong in the opening Group B match at the BCU International Stadium in Coffs Harbour.

Coach Tom Sermanni is already without the services of key players in midfielder Sally Shipard (foot) and striker Caitlin Munoz (knee) though both are expected to also be available for the June matches.

Returning to the squad for the first time since November's Peace Cup in Korea is pacy striker Lisa DeVanna who has spent the last few months playing in England with Doncaster Belles. Defender Clare Polkinghorne has also been added to the squad traveling to Chinese Taipei.

"It is obviously disruptive on a number of levels for the squad to have these injuries but on the positive side we now have good depth and are more prepared for such eventualities," said Matildas Coach Tom Sermanni.

"It is of course highly unfortunate for Jenna and the timing of the injury makes it even harder to accept given she has just made her national team debut in her home town. Jenna has the makings of a really good player with genuine speed, a nose for goal and she is also starting to adapt to the rigours of what is required physically at senior level. Jenna has a good attitude and I have full confidence she will return and stake a strong claim for selection once again."

The squad will depart Wednesday and return to Australia next Tuesday.

Australia are grouped with seeded team DPR Korea (North Korea) as well as Hong Kong and Chinese Taipei. DPR Korea defeated Chinese Taipei 8-0 in the other group match played in Pyongyang on Saturday.

The other qualifying group consists of seeded-team Japan, plus Korea Republic, Thailand and Vietnam.

The qualifying matches will be held between April and August with only the top team in each group to progress to the 2008 Olympic Games.

DPR Korea are Asia's highest ranked team listed at 5 on the FIFA Women's World Rankings, while Australia are now ranked at an all-time high of 14.

Australia easily navigated through the first stage of qualifying in February defeating Myanmar, Uzbekistan and Chinese Taipei.

Australia was eliminated in the group stage after qualifying as host nation in 2000, while three years ago in Greece the team narrowly failed to reach the medal round losing 2-1 in their quarter final against Sweden. Australia did not qualify for the initial women's Olympic football tournament in 1996.

Matildas open final stage of Olympic qualifying with 15-0 rout of Hong Kong

The Matildas have commenced the second and final stage of qualifying for the Beijing Olympics with a comprehensive 15-0 win over Hong Kong at the BCU International Stadium in Coffs Harbour.

The Matildas raced to a six goal half time lead before adding a further nine goals in the second half in a match played in sunny but blustery conditions.

Striker Kate Gill scored five goals for the second consecutive international match following her five-goal haul against Chinese Taipei in February. Midfielder Collette McCallum scored a hat-trick while there were also goals for Sarah Walsh 2, Cheryl Salisbury 2, Joanne Peters, Joanne Burgess and Danielle Small.

Coffs Harbour local Jenna Tristram came on at half time for her senior national team debut.

The result falls short of the Matildas record 21-0 scoreline achieved against American Samoa in 1998.

Australia will travel to Chinese Taipei on Wednesday for the second Group B match next Sunday in Taipei.

Australia are also grouped with seeded team DPR Korea (North Korea) with only the top team in each group to progress to the 2008 Beijing Olympics.

DPR Korea are Asia's highest ranked team listed at 5 on the FIFA Women's World Rankings, while Australia are now ranked at an all-time high of 14. Hong Kong are ranked 68 and Chinese Taipei 28.

The Qantas Matildas have already qualified for the 2007 FIFA Women's World Cup also to be held in China, September 10-30.
