Manly United 0
Blacktown City Demons 3

INCENSED Manly United coach Phil Moss has launched a stinging attack on Football NSW and the standard of refereeing claiming his team were "robbed" at Fairfax Community Stadium on Sunday.

An infuriated Moss lambasted referee Peter Vrtkovski at full-time after the whistleblower failed to award his team two penalties and send off Demons playmaker Gabriel Mendez for deliberate handball.

"One of those penalties go our way and the game changes completely" said Moss. "The boys played their best game all season but sadly that didn't reflect on the scoreboard."

"I thought the referee's performance was inept . . . I feel my players were robbed today," an angry Moss said at fulltime.

"Football NSW has got to improve the standard by having more training for these referees and more accountability for their decisions".

"A referee's inspector comes to all the games, assesses their performance and we don't get any feedback on what they do to improve it".

"These players put massive effort into being fit and being good enough to play this standard and I don't see the refereeing improve one bit".

The biggest turning point of the match came in the 29th minute when United, already trailing 2-0 after a couple of early goals, were denied a penalty for a deliberate handball on the goal line by Mendez.

The incident also would have also seen the former Northern Spirit midfielder given an early shower.

"Those decisions never go for us here," Moss said.

"It's a nightmare place to play when it comes to big decisions."

The refereeing controversy overshadowed one of the peninsula club's best attacking displays of the season."

United outplayed their more highly fancied opponents for long periods but couldn't take their chances. In contrast Demons striker Tolgey Ozbey, who had scored four goals in his last two games against Manly, showed his class with two expert finishes.

Without young defender Beau Busch, who spent much of the week in hospital with a blood infection, United's defence looked vulnerable and Swancott had a day he'd rather forget.

The experienced custodian was left embarrassed when he lost an innocuous 35m cross in the sun with the ball hitting him in the chest before rolling into the net.



Blacktown City have returned to top spot on the Premier League competition table but in an ominous warning to other clubs, coach Aytek Genc still believes his side is yet to play its best football.

Their 3-0 win over Manly United F.C. at Fairfax Community Stadium, may not have been on their 'best of' highlights reel but it was enough to grab a valuable three points and the 'favourites' tag for the second round.

"Manly are a tough side and we didn't play anywhere near our best," said Genc. "It's a nice feeling to be on top especially when you're still building towards your best form."

With Bobby Dragas back in the starting eleven, the Demons looked a lot more composed alongside man of the match Mirko Jurilj.

With Ozbey again grabbing himself a double the signs are ominous for the Demons who looked solid without being brilliant.

James Monie the pick for Manly who remain in the top four despite the loss.

In the early game the under-20s went down 1-0.

United are at home against APIA Leichhardt on Sunday.

Qantas Socceroos "Road to Asian Cup" finalised

The Qantas Socceroos 'Road to the Asian Cup' was finalised today with an international game against the Singapore national team added to the team's match schedule.

With blockbuster games in Australia against Uruguay and Argentina during June already in place, the Qantas Socceroos will now have three matches to build up to Asia's premier football event.

The team will next assemble in Sydney ahead of the re-match of the 2006 FIFA World Cup qualifier against Uruguay on 2 June and then head to Melbourne to take on the number one ranked team in World football Argentina at the MCG on 6 June.

The players will then take a two-week recovery break before assembling in Singapore on 21 June.

"We want to give the team the best possible opportunity to achieve success at the Asian Cup and these matches will give Australia a great platform to perform at the tournament," said FFA CEO Mr Ben Buckley.

"We have two massive home matches which will provide a tough test for the team and then the camp and match in Singapore will allow the team to fine tune and acclimatise ahead of our first Asian Cup match."

Singapore missed out on qualifying for the Asian Cup after finishing third in a tough group behind Iraq and China.

"The camp and match in Singapore will give us a good indication of what to expect at the Asian Cup," said National Coach Graham Arnold.

"Acclimatisation will be a key to success at the tournament so training and playing in Singapore will get us in good shape for the conditions that we will face for the tournament."

"All three matches are vital." The games in Australia will be the players last chance to push for selection for the Asian Cup and the tough opponents will give us the hard workout we need."

Tickets for Australia's home matches against Uruguay and Argentina are now on sale.

All three matches and Australia's games at the 2007 AFC Asian Cup will be shown live and exclusive on FOX SPORTS.

Qantas Under 23's suffer loss in crucial Beijing qualifying match

The Qantas Under 23s have suffered a 2-1 loss to Saudi Arabia in their Beijing Olympic qualifying match played overnight at the Prince Mohammad bin Fahad Stadium, Dammam.

Australia held the lead courtesy of a goal in first half injury time from Newcastle Jets striker Mark Bridge, but two goals in the space of eight minutes mid-way through the second half were enough for the home team to claim all three points.

The Qantas Under 23s played the last half hour with ten men after debutant skipper Adrian Leijer was dismissed for a second caution. Ben Griffin and Ruben Zadkovich will join Leijer on the sidelines for next month's crucial home fixture against Iran in Adelaide after each received a second caution of the campaign.

Australia's defeat combined with a 3-0 win for Iran over Jordan, sees Australia slip to third on goal difference behind the Iranians. With four of the six rounds now completed Saudi Arabia are on top of Group D with nine points, ahead of Iran (goal difference 3-1) and Australia on five points (4-3), with Jordan on two points.

Saudi Arabia held the upper hand for lengthy periods of the match however Australia took the lead moments before halftime with Bridge volleying the ball into the net after Bruce Djite headed down a cross from Kristian Sarkies.

The home side equalized from the penalty spot 13 minutes into the second half through Jaffin Al-Bishi with Leijer receiving his second caution after fouling an opponent. The Saudis took the lead eight minutes later through Youssef al-Salem when a long ball over the defence left an exposed Australian goalkeeper Danny Vukovic with no chance.

Australia were denied a late equalizer with two minutes remaining when Sarkies was ruled offside after finishing a cross from Bridge.

Australia will now face Iran in the penultimate group match at Hindmarsh Stadium on May 16.

AFC Asian Cup 2007 – Ticketing Arrangements

FFA has not yet been provided with the official ticketing policy for the forthcoming AFC Asian Cup. We are hoping to receive more information in the near future. However, we, like many Australian fans, are aware of media reports suggesting that tickets will be put on sale through ticket agents (e.g. Thai Ticketmaster) in the host countries from this Friday, April 20. FFA has not had any formal advice in this regard.

However, if we assume that the information in the Thai media, and the website of Thai Ticketmaster [www.thaiticketmaster.com] is accurate – that tickets will go on sale there this Friday, then FFA believes it is appropriate for us to state our current position formally today – before Friday's possible public on sell in Thailand.

In the absence of more detailed information, FFA is not currently in a position to mount a local ticketing program for Australian fans. Therefore, our advice for Australian supporters seeking tickets (and / or travel and accommodation) for the Asian Cup is to visit and monitor the website of the AFC & Thai Ticketmaster.

If tickets do indeed go on public sale this Friday, we expect that Australian supporters will be able to buy tickets (tickets only, without travel or accommodation) directly from these ticketing agents. Note that these tickets will not be in any designated Australian supporter areas in the venue. For Australian supporters requiring accommodation and / or travel to or around the Asian Cup, the FFA has been in discussion with a number of travel and tour operators over recent months. While the FFA is not in a position to officially "endorse" these organisations, Australian supporters are welcome to contact these operators at their discretion. They include:
