## Premier League

Manly United 1  
Apia Leichhardt 2

Manly United F.C. coach Phil Moss has pledged to make wholesale changes to his side in the wake of their 2-1 loss to the A.P.I.A.-Leichhardt Tigers at Cromer Park on Sunday afternoon.

Moss was scathing in his assessment, describing his sides performance as "poor" and "the worst I have seen by any Manly side over the past five years."

"We got bossed around on our home ground and that is embarrassing," he said. "We were touched up physically in the first half and paid the price."

With Socceroo coach Graham Arnold in the stands it was the Tigers who made all the early running adopting a physical approach in defence and playing an expansive game in attack.

Up 1-0 after 16 minutes following an Anthony Hartshorn strike, the visitors should have been 2-0 up shortly after when Franco Parisi had his penalty well saved by Manly United F.C. goalkeeper Brad Swancott.



Robbie Cattnach giving the home side an equaliser in the last minute of the first half with a brilliant finish.

Fast earning a reputation as the leagues most feared striker, Cattnach was able to fire a left foot volley on the run after he pounced on a ball played in by Richie Williams.

Moss described his team's first half performance as the "worst in a very long time" and only another piece of brilliance from Robbie Cattnach sent the teams to the sheds at 1-1.

But it was the 83rd minute strike from Tigers substitute Joe Bruni that gave Moss most of his heartburn as the home side slipped out of the top four for the first time this season.

Bruni pouncing on a loose ball in the Manly penalty box after a shot from Christian Care could only be touched onto the crossbar by a diving Swancott.

"We have a number of players in the first eleven not performing and we need to make some urgent changes," said Moss. "It's not acceptable to play at this level and not take pride in ourselves."

Asked what changes would be made to turn around the mini-form slump Moss said: "Definitely personnel . . . there's no two ways about it.

"We can use copouts, we can look for excuses but ultimately there are some boys who are below their best.

"Too many quality players aren't aiming up at the moment.

"Some players may be turning up with the wrong head on and maybe a couple of boys need a rest, maybe a couple need a kick up the backside.

"But we've got players who are champing at the bit to get into the team and they will have to get a chance."

The Tigers again showing why they are the dark horses of the competition with the win.

Buddy Farah and Michael Galluzzo working hard at the back while Ian King directed traffic in the midfield.

The combination of the hardworking Robert Younis and the flamboyant Franco Parisi setting up the win with their hard running physical style and good combination.

"The Tigers thoroughly deserved the win and they'll prove to be a hard side to beat in the second round," said Moss.

The Tigers moving into third spot with their fourth win of the season.



## 2007 Hyundai A-League Preseason Cup goes regional

The 2007 Pre-Season Cup competition will once again give regional football fans an opportunity to watch the Hyundai A-League clubs go through their pre-season preparations following today's draw announcement by Football Federation Australia (FFA).

**Group B:** Central Coast Mariners, Wellington Phoenix, Queensland Roar & Sydney FC

The competition kicks off on the weekend of the 14-15 July and each team will play the other teams in their group once over three (3) rounds.

Following the Group phase, the eight (8) teams will play-off for positions 1-8 in a knock-out phase over two rounds with the winner presented the 2007 Pre-Season Cup on Sunday 12 August. This format will ensure that all teams will be involved in competitive matches right through till the end of the competition.

The 2007 Pre-Season Cup will see Central Coast Mariners host the Hyundai A-League's newest club, the Wellington Phoenix at Bluetongue Stadium, Gosford, whilst the Newcastle Jets and Perth Glory will take their match to Port Macquarie.

"It is also well known that Wellingtonians have a passion for sport and supporting their local teams. We are sure that they will embrace their new football team in a similar manner", concluded Buckley.

The license for the Hyundai A-League club is held by New Zealand Soccer and has been sub-licensed to Century Football Limited which is headed by local property developer Terry Serepisos.

Based in the New Zealand capital city, the Wellington Phoenix will play their home matches at Westpac Stadium and will be coached by the current All-Whites (New Zealand National Team) Coach, Ricki Herbert. Herbert is currently in the process of assembling his playing roster with Kiwi players tipped to feature prominently in his squad.

## FFA releases Hyundai A-League 2007/08 draw

Newcomers Wellington Phoenix will get a tough induction into the Hyundai A-League after it was revealed today that they will host reigning Champions & Premiers Melbourne Victory in round one of the 2007/08 season.

The much anticipated first round which will kick off on Friday 24 August will see Sydney FC host local rivals Central Coast Mariners while Queensland Roar is at home to Adelaide United and Newcastle Jets travel to face Perth Glory.

In addition to the opening round the draw highlights include:

Melbourne Victory fans will get their first chance to see the premiers at home in round two when they play Perth Glory.

A Grand Final re-match will take place in round three with Adelaide United looking to seek revenge at home to Melbourne Victory.

New Years Eve blockbuster between Central Coast Mariners and Melbourne Victory.

This same fixture last season saw the Mariners set a club regular season home attendance record.

A four-week finals series commencing on 25 January with the Grand Final to be played on Sunday 17 February.

Every match will be shown live and exclusive on Fox Sports.

The Hyundai A-League 2007/08 season will again be contested over 21 rounds, with a one-week break over the Christmas period (21 – 23 December). The final round of the season (Round 21) is scheduled for the weekend of 18-20 January 2008, which includes the blockbuster Sydney FC v Melbourne Victory clash on the final day of the round, with the team at the top of the table at the conclusion of round 21 crowned the Hyundai A-League Premiers.

The Hyundai A-League 2008 Finals Series will be contested by the top four teams at the end of Round 21. The first leg of the Hyundai A-League 2007 Semi-Finals will be played on the 25 & 27 January 2008 with the Hyundai A-League 2008 Grand Final scheduled for Sunday 17 February 2008. The winner of the Hyundai A-League 2008 Grand Final will be crowned Champions.

"The second season of the Hyundai A-League was a terrific success and we have a great base now to build upon next season" said FFA CEO Mr Ben Buckley.

"We now have two seasons of experience behind us and with the support of the clubs and the venues, we have developed a very competitive draw."

"With more of our Qantas Socceros returning and some other exciting players entering the competition, season three promises to reach even bigger heights than was achieved in season two.

"I would also like to take this opportunity to thank our partners; Hyundai, Qantas, Telstra, Powerade, Zurich and Fox Sports, as well as all the club sponsors for their valued ongoing support of the Hyundai A-League competition," concluded Buckley.

Fox Sports will again broadcast all the Hyundai A-League 2007/08 matches "Live & Exclusive" as well as the AFC Champions League matches that the Hyundai A-League representatives will play in the competition.

## Matildas will have to perform in close group says Coach

Australian coach Tom Sermanni believes the Matildas will have to be well prepared to overcome their group opponents despite avoiding reigning

champions Germany, world number one ranked nation USA and hosts China at the draw for the 2007 FIFA Women's World Cup held overnight in China.

The Matildas were drawn into Group C alongside Norway, Canada and Ghana at the 16-nation tournament to be held in September.

"It's a reasonable draw for us but undoubtedly we will have to be well prepared and be on top of our game to overcome what are strong opponents," said Sermanni speaking from Wuhan.

"It could have been worse and it could have better, but what it does do is give us a chance and that's as much as you can hope for in a World Cup.

"I don't think there is a great deal of difference between all the teams. To be honest, Canada and Norway are very similar in style; closely matched in

their ability. They are well structured, physically tough and very competitive.

"Ghana is different in that they are a team that will be quick, skilful, but very unpredictable.

"Overall I think we have a fair chance of progressing to the quarter finals if everyone is fit and healthy and we play to our potential."

Norway, the top seeded nation in the group, won the FIFA Women's World Cup in 1995 as well as the gold medal at the 2000 Sydney Olympics and are ranked three in the world. Canada were semi finalists at the 2003 World Cup and have a current world ranking of ten. Ghana are the lowest ranked team in the tournament at 48 but the Africans have denied the Matildas at the last two tournaments recording a win and a draw in their only two meetings against Australia.

Australia will open their campaign against Ghana on September 12 in Hangzhou, followed by the match against Norway on September 15 in the same city before the final group match against Canada on September 19 in Chengdu.

The top two teams in Australia's group will progress to the quarter finals and meet the top two teams of Group D which features China, Denmark, Brazil and New Zealand.

Group A contains Germany, Japan, England and Argentina. Group B features USA, Korea DPR, Sweden and Nigeria.

The 16-nation tournament will be held in the cities of Chengdu, Hangzhou, Shanghai, Tianjin and Wuhan, September 10-30.

The Matildas, now ranked 14th in the world, qualified for the World Cup courtesy of finishing runners-up at last year's AFC Women's Asian Cup in Adelaide after losing the final on penalties against China.

Australia have appeared in three previous FIFA Women's World Cup tournaments in 1995, 1999 and 2003.

The Matildas are currently attempting to qualify for the Beijing Olympics with qualification likely to be decided in early June when the team travels to DPR (North) Korea before the return match in Coffs Harbour on June 10.

## Matildas Captain Cheryl Salisbury first Australian to score for FIFA XI

Matildas captain Cheryl Salisbury became the first Australian to score for a FIFA XI when she netted for the FIFA Women's World Stars against China in Wuhan in a match played ahead of the draw for the 2007 FIFA Women's World Cup.

China won the match 3-2 with a goal in the final minute after Australia's most capped male or female international had drawn the two team's level at 2-2 three minutes before half time. The 33-year-old Salisbury heading in from close range converting a free-kick played into the penalty area by Brazilian Daniela.

The match was also significant for Tammy Ogston who became the first Australian to referee a FIFA World Stars match.
