## NSW Premier League

Manly United 2  
Wollongong Wolves 2

The Wollongong Wolves let a two goal lead slip through their fingers at Cromer Park on Sunday, and were lucky to walk away with a point after Manly United failed to find a winning third goal.

A 2-2 draw was enough for Manly to retain fifth spot on the Vodafone Premier League ladder, while the Wolves move ahead of Sutherland Shire into sixth place courtesy of a superior goal difference.

Manly got off to a cracking start and went about dominating a fast paced opening forty-five that could have ended 3-0 in their favour if it weren't for solid defending from Wollongong's centre backs.

Midfielder Ashley Ryan blasted wide of the goal, while James Monie, Roberto Hamad and Andrew Mailer rose above the Wolves' defence on numerous occasions but failed to direct their headers under the cross bar.

Phil Moss's team put together some attractive build-up play but seemed to be misfiring in the attacking third of the pitch.

Wolves on the other hand were breaking at every opportunity thanks to blistering performances from Osagie Ederaro and Balla Conda. They finally punished Manly's lack of killer instinct when midfielder Michael Hawrynsink picked out an unmarked Daniel Aliffi on the edge of the 18 yard box.

In textbook fashion Aliffi controlled, turned, and drilled the ball into the right hand corner of the net to put his team ahead.

Barely two minutes later Osagie Ederaro tore down the left wing and just as everyone - including Manly

Keeper Brad Swancott - expected him to cross the ball, Ederaro unleashed a venomous 25 yard shot that caught Swancott out of position and beat him on the near post.

Two minutes, two goals, and you could hear a bee fart at Cromer Park.

Much to the relief of the home crowd the second half was a different story.

Manly came out looking much more convincing in the attacking third and stopped trying to go straight through the defense, instead opting to go around and over the Wolves backline.

This change in tactics was rewarded in the 54th minute when Andrew Mailer got a head on the end of a Joey Schirripa cross to pull one back for United.

Less than ten minutes later James Monie won a crucial tackle that allowed Joey Schirripa to bag another assist, this time setting up Robbie Cattanaich who equalised with a shot over the keeper from 15 yards.

But by the time the final whistle blew Manly were left ruing several chances to pinch all three points.

Robbie Cattanaich hit the crossbar with a bending free kick and failed to convert a one on one with the Wolves' Keeper, while James Monie struck the crossbar with a header just five minutes from full time.

"To be honest I expected to win here today. I think we were the better side, we played all the football, we asked all the questions. But if you give sloppy balls away you are going to get punished and that's what happened to us" said Manly captain Richard Williams after the game.

However his Wollongong counterpart, Ben Blake, felt the result justified the game.

"Probably in the end it did. I don't think we played anywhere near our best. We were fortunate enough to put our chances away in the first half, and we were lucky to hang on in the second in the end."

Manly coach Phil Moss says his team will need to work on their basic principles if they hope to make the finals come season's end.

"It was the little things that cost us the two goals. Giving away possession on the halfway line and two passes later the ball is in the back of our net. The second goal we gave Ederaro too much space and he's punished us. At the end of the year those little things could be the difference between making the finals or not, so they are the things we'll be working on from here on."

## MWFA Premier League

Talk of Brookie's demise a tad early says Strikers boss Jason Avedissian. STRIKERS coach Mark Gale says it's premature to write-off Brookvale's title hopes despite his youthful team brushing past the defending champions at St Matthews Farm on Saturday.

Four first half goals to the Strikers - two to striker Ash Short - was enough to sink the Blues. The loss was Brookvale's second from five outings and has cast serious question marks over the club's ability to win an incredible ninth premiership in a decade.

The 4-2 victory sees the Strikers leapfrog Brookvale into the top four. But Gale believes it's too early to write off the perennial champions.

"They have dominated the Premier League for the past 15 years and have still got a lot of life in them," he said yesterday.

"They have got a lot of experienced campaigners."

"As the season wears on and it becomes a grind, it will hold them in good stead."

"They are still a good side."

But not in the opening 45 minutes on Saturday as the Strikers dominated.

"It was a good result for us," Gale said.

Central to the victory was midfielder Andrew Frith who Gale named as his best. Short opened the scoring for the Strikers with an early goal before the Blues levelled through a penalty.

A second Short goal and further successful attempts from Eric Talarico and Nigel Mahoney compounded the Blues opening half troubles.

At David Thomas, league newcomers Narrabeen sprinted to equal share of second place with a 3-0 shut-out of Manly Vale.

In other results, the BTH Raiders notched up their second win of the season with a 1-0 victory over Harbord, Mosman ensured Dee Why would endure another winless day with a 4-0 thrashing, Pittwater RSL maintained their place at the top of the ladder, beating Beacon Hill (2-1), Wakehurst edged past Forest Killarney 2-1.

## Former Socceroos to form next coach generation

An impressive array of Australian footballing talent led by three former Australian captains and a host of Hyundai A-League players are currently undertaking the inaugural B Certificate coaching course as part of Football Federation Australia's new coach educational structure.

The 17 attendees have a combined total of over 300 appearances for the Socceroos plus thousands of matches at national domestic competition level. The three former national captains attending the course are Alex Tobin, Tony Vidmar and Kevin Muscat, while other former Socceroos include Ian Gray, Ante Milicic and current Matildas assistant coach Robbie Hooker.

Amongst other attendees are Central Coast Mariners coach Lawrie McKinna, Queensland Roar defender Stuart McLaren and Mariners duo from last season Andre Gumprecht and Wayne O'Sullivan.

The course is part of the Advanced Pathway which is

primarily aimed at the professional and semi-professional coach, and also at experienced players who wish to pursue a coaching career.

"This course is the first of FFA's new Advanced Coaching Courses, which are under the auspices of the AFC," said FFA National Coach Education Manager, Kelly Cross.

"In the past, Australian coaches had to travel to Europe, or elsewhere, for such high-level courses. These AFC-endorsed courses are recognised as equivalent to those conducted by UEFA."

Attendees who pass the B Certificate can progress to the A Certificate and then the Pro Diploma. The FFA introduced a new Coach Education Structure on 1 January 2007.

## Sydney FC held to draw

Sydney FC has drawn with Chinese side Shanghai Shenhua 0-0 in a frustrating and sometimes heated Asian Champions League encounter at a rain-soaked Aussie Stadium on Wednesday night.

A superb goal-keeping effort from Shanghai's Chen Zhang was the difference between the sides as he kept out at least five sure-fire chances to deny Sydney the win, while Sydney midfielder Ufuk Talay blew a golden chance when he missed a penalty midway through the first half.

A heavy shower of rain half an hour before the opening whistle didn't dampen the enthusiasm of 14,786 fans at Aussie Stadium.

The draw sets Sydney up for a tantalising final group match against Group E leaders Urawa Reds in Saitama on May 23 after the J-League champions were held to a 3-3 draw by Indonesian side Persib Kediri in the corresponding group match in Solo City earlier in the evening.

Sydney, a point behind the Reds, must manufacture a win in Japan to progress to the quarter-finals, while Urawa needs only a draw to progress to the next round. However, Sydney will have to play without effervescent right-back Robbie Middleby, who picked up his second yellow card of the campaign in the 33rd minute of the match.

Sydney started the match against Shanghai Shenhua full of running and created all the early chances, but couldn't convert due mainly to the heroics of Zhang.

Corica had the first full-blooded shot in the eighth minute, sending in a rocket from 25 yards out, which was pushed behind by Zhang. From the ensuing corner Carney rose above the pack only to see his header tipped over the bar by the livewire custodian.

Just three minutes later Alex Brosque's left-footed shot from the left edge of the penalty box narrowly skidded past the right post.

Sydney had the best chance of the match in the 25th minute when awarded a dubious penalty for a hand

ball. Midfielder Mark Milligan played a nice one-two with Corica and ran into space on the right flank. He fired in an early cross and the ball clipped Shanghai defender Zhiquing Liu on his hand, but clearly outside the area.

The Singaporean linesman signalled a penalty and match referee Malik Abdul Bashir had no hesitation in pointing to the spot.

But justice was served, as it often is in these games, when Talay stepped up only to see his shot cannon off the crossbar.

Carney went close just a couple of minutes later with a dipping long-range shot that Zhang did extremely well to keep out of the net, while Milligan did well to clear the ball just a few metres out from his own line from Shanghai's only attacking chance in the first half from a corner.

Shanghai showed some early attacking venom to open the second half but it didn't take long for Sydney to wrest back control.

A looping shot from Carney in the 48th minute and a stabbed shot from Brosque a few minutes later whipped agonisingly over the bar, while a David Zdrilic header in the 52nd minute shaved the outside of the right post.

Sydney continued to create a plethora of chances and Zhang again kept his side in the match when he produced a fantastic diving save to deny Brosque's vicious left-foot shot from inside the penalty area in the 73rd minute.

Just moments later, Carney saved Sydney's bacon at the other end when he cleared Fernando Correa's glancing header off the line following a corner kick.

Milligan fired a powerful long-range volley just wide of the left post in the 80th minute before Zhang produced another fine save to deflect Mark Rudan's stinging long-range effort.

Rudan again went close with a header in the injury time, but it was not to be Sydney's night as the match finished in a draw.

## Phoenix sign Brazilian

Wellington's Phoenix has completed its first foreign signing for the club's inaugural season in the Hyundai A-League - Brazilian Daniel Lins Cortes.

The 27-year-old left back/midfielder - known as Daniel - is currently playing for Brazilian side Guarani. He has played most of his career in the Brazilian Campeonato, including time with Juventude and Botafogo. He also played for Dutch first division side FC Twente and Videoton in Hungary.

Phoenix coach Ricki Herbert said the signing of Daniel, a dead-ball specialist that likes to range forward, was a key to how Phoenix would play this season. He will likely play in midfield at Phoenix.

Other Hyundai A-League clubs, including Adelaide United, had actively chased the 180cm, 78kg Brazilian.

"It's great for Phoenix to get a player of this calibre - especially with other A-League clubs interested in his services," Herbert said.

"South American players are well known for their technical ability and we are sure he will bring that to Phoenix."

"It's important that we as a club make sure he feels comfortable in his new environment."

Herbert said after watching considerable video footage of the Brazilian his contacts in Australia and South America had helped secure the deal.

The latest signing brings to 11 the number of players confirmed by Phoenix.

New Zealanders Tim Brown, Glen Moss, Mark Paston, Steven Old and Costa Barbarouses have signed on along with Australians Ross Aloisi, Steven O'Dor, Vince Lia, Richard Johnson and Michael Ferrante.

## Sport rage prevention a priority this winter

With the winter sport season underway, sporting clubs and organisations are being urged to act early and nip ugly sport behaviour in the bud before it becomes a problem, the NSW Government announced today.

The Minister for Sport and Recreation, Graham West, said recent incidents of abuse towards children by coaches and parents were absolutely unacceptable.

"Yelling abuse and placing stress on children during matches spoils their experience and can turn them off sport for life," said the Minister. "I urge all adults involved in junior sport - whether as coaches, officials, administrators or parents - to keep emotions in check on the sidelines.

"More than 587,000 children play sport after school and on weekends in NSW and it's critical we strive to ensure their experience is uplifting."

The Minister congratulated Football NSW for taking a firm stance against abusive behaviour by coaches at the start of the season.

"More than 4,500 education kits have been distributed to sporting clubs throughout the state, and these clubs are now armed with the tools to combat the issue at the grass roots."

"Club committees have ordered over 160,000 free promotional materials since January, including posters, flyers, audio ground announcements and brochures."

"The kit also contains a guide for club committees to help them manage sport rage incidents when they arise."

"This includes having the necessary policies and processes in place and training aids for frontline volunteers such as ground officials and referees on how to diffuse anger and conflict in sport."

The Minister urged parents to talk to children about the fun side of playing sport, not just the end result.

"Remember, only three per cent of children go on to become elite athletes but 100 per cent can enjoy the experience and take it with them into adulthood if we let them!"

"Sport provides fantastic opportunities for kids to make friends, master new skills and learn about key values such as respect, responsibility and teamwork."

"Remember - we've all got a role to play in saying no to sport rage."

## Eriksson interest in Toon

Former England coach Sven-Goran Eriksson would be interested in talking to Newcastle about the vacant manager's job.

There has been no contact between the Magpies and the Swede's representatives in the wake of Glenn Roeder's departure.

However, his agent Athole Still has revealed the job at St James' Park is just the kind he would seriously consider.

Eriksson fared well in a phone poll of fans carried out by Newcastle-based radio station Metro, although he is not understood to figure high on chairman Freddy Shepherd's shortlist, which is topped by overwhelming favourite Sam Allardyce with Lyon manager Gerard Houllier emerging as a surprise candidate.

Still told PA Sport: "There has been no contact whatsoever, but if Newcastle were interested in Sven-Goran Eriksson, I am sure Sven-Goran Eriksson would be interested in talking to Newcastle."

Only last month, Shepherd dismissed speculation Eriksson was being lined up to replace Roeder.

However, the 51-year-old's resignation on Sunday saw Allardyce swiftly installed as the main contender with most bookmakers suspending betting.

Allardyce's own departure from Bolton with two years of his contract still to run means there is an issue of compensation and that could yet prove a stumbling block, while allegations made against him - which he strongly denied - by the Panorama bungs programme are a further complicating factor.

Eriksson's pedigree means the link is inevitable, although Shepherd has repeatedly played down an interest in the man who quit as England manager after last summer's World Cup finals.

He has been touted for virtually every high-profile job which has come up since, although is awaiting the right opportunity.

Still said: "Sven is very keen to get back into club football and he would be interested in talking to any club which had real ambition."

## Sydney Olympic snap up Nick Carle

In what's been seen as a massive coup for struggling NSW Premier League side Sydney Olympic, last season's A-League Player of the Year Nick Carle has signed on with the Blues for the remainder of the season.

Carle was previously linked with a short-term move to his former club the Marconi Stallions but Olympic won the battle in signing the Socceroo star who is sure to put more bums on seats at Belmore Sports Ground.

The Newcastle Jets playmaker had a remarkable year last season and is hoping that his services can lift Olympic off the foot of the ladder and steer them clear of the dreaded wooden spoon, a position the club has never had to contend with in their history.

Carle is also holding onto hopes that the move to the Blues, which will get him into the routine of playing weekly football, will also further his chances in making the Asian Cup squad for the Soccerooos

In other Blues news, former Olympic cult hero and current Assistant Coach Chris Kalantzis has been registered for the rest of the season and made his first appearance with the Blues as a player in the recent Tiger Turf clash against Epping Eastwood.
