## NSW Premier League

**Manly United FC** 4  
**Blacktown City Demons** 1

Current NSW Premier League leaders Blacktown City Demons were brought back down to earth last Sunday as a fiery Manly United side hit four past Aytek Genc's men in their 4-1 victory at Seymour Shaw in the Tiger Turf Semi-Final.

The victory for the high flying Manly side has now set a Grand-Final Tiger Turf date with the Wollongong Wolves who defeated Dandaloo 3-1 in the day's other Semi-Final.

After days of rain, the classy Tiger Turf pitch held up very well and looked as though no water hit the Sutherland area in what were otherwise cool and windy conditions in the Shire.

Phil Moss' men were certainly on another level as they astonishingly hit four past a despairing Demons side that prior to the game, looked odds on favourites to take out the prestigious Tiger Turf Cup.

And it was all Blacktown in the opening exchanges of the match as the Demons' pivotal playmaker Gabriel Mendez had his volley outside the box sail wide off the mark in the fourth minute.

Three minutes later and it was Tolgay Ozbey's chance to shine as his darting run past a couple of Manly United defenders saw the striker take an unfortunate weak shot upon his route to goal that went safely into the hands of Brad Swancott.

It was Adrian Webster's turn next in the ninth minute to have gone close with a chance as his volley also sailed wide off the post.

Early signs were promising for Genc's men as they took control of the game but Manly United started to play its own brand of football and got its first chance in the eighteenth minute when Brad Groves had a speculative 40-yard crack that failed to trouble Ivan Necevski in goals.

Just when you thought Blacktown were set to capitalise it was Manly who opened up the scoring in the twenty-second minute by the club's top striker Robbie Cattanach.

Manly's new Serbian import Dusan Mihajlovic won his side a free-kick after Bobby Dragas bundled over the striker just outside the box.

Cattanach stepped up from the free-kick and whacked his shot in the top left corner which gave Necevski no chance. Cattanach then turned provider in the twenty-fifth minute as he gave a neat ball to

fellow team-mate Joey Schirripa just outside the box, but his resulting shot went over the Demons bar.

Blacktown keeper Necevski almost cost his side a second in the twenty-seventh when his miss-timed clearance fell to the feet of Cattanach just outside the box but his shot failed to hit the target much to the relief of the Demons shot stopper.

Controversy hit the match in the thirty-first minute as the Demons looked as though they scored an equaliser. 'Chi Chi' Mendez' free-kick from the right hand side of the post found Bobby Dragas' head whose looping header looked as though it went in after smashing the inside up-right of the post but the goal failed to stand.

From the resulting play, Schirripa tremendously beat Mendez on the right hand side and sent a gem of a cross to Cattanach who hit the ball sweetly as it went beyond Necevski's reach for Manly's second.



Manly were on fire and almost got a third in the thirty-fifth minute as Cattanach sent a great cross to Groves' head which hit the back of the net, but the goal failed to stand as Groves was in an off-side position.

The Demons had two brilliant chances to peg at least a goal back before half time as in the thirty-seventh minute Mendez sliced a neat through ball to Ozbey who with the goal at his mercy, slipped the ball wide.

While finally in the forty-first minute Leo Carle threaded a terrific through ball to Ozbey inside the box but again, the Demons striker pushed his effort wide off the Manly goals.

Moss' men grew in confidence as the second half started and got a third which all but buried Blacktown's hopes of a comeback as Ashley Ryan slotted home from the easiest of positions a couple of meters from the goal-line after Cattanach's

attempted shot fell straight to Ryan.

Everything Manly touched turned to gold as it was their day and killed off the game in the fifty-first minute when Schirripa yet again sent a tantalising cross to Groves inside the box who finished off superbly.

The boys from Cromer weren't finished there and pushed for more and Cattanach almost grabbed his hat-tick in the fifty-fifth minute after a precise through ball from Groves, but his resulting shot was well saved by Necevski.

The Demons side were down for the count and it showed especially after they copped the fourth goal. Schirripa, who proved to be a massive player for Manly, almost got on the score-sheet in the sixtieth minute, but his shot from inside the box was well handled by Necevski.

Genc's side were merely playing for a bit of pride towards the later stages of the game and Mendez almost pegged a consolation goal in the sixty-sixth minute, but his free-kick sailed over the bar.

It proved to be a tough day in the office for Ozbey who squandered yet another chance in the seventy-third minute when he beat two Manly defenders outside the box but his resulting shot was saved by Swancott.

Blacktown finally salvaged some bit of pride in the seventy-fourth minute when promising young substitute striker Adam Biddle finished off nicely with a nice shot inside the Manly box.

Manly were simply unstoppable and even though they had a sluggish start to the match, their fortunes turned for the better and easily disposed of a near to full strength Blacktown side.

Schirripa stood out for Moss' men as did Cattanach, Julliard and Groves while for Blacktown, Mendez tried hard as did Roodenburg and youngster Biddle.

A delighted Moss sounded out his team's great performance against the Demons however pushed the notion that nothing has been won yet.

"We're not celebrating yet, it was a terrific performance by the boys and was a massive win against Blacktown who we play again this week in what is a crucial game for us in the league, but we want to keep our feet firmly on the ground."

"We are honoured though to be in the finals against Wollongong which should be a great clash. "After we went up 3-0 the boys had their minds firmly focused on the league match where we hope to do the same but we know we will come up against a fiery Demons outfit."

Moss stated to ABSW that his side followed a game plan much similar to the one they put out when they played the Demons in round eight but lost 3-0 on the day.

"We played pretty much the same game plan as what we put out against them in round 8 and things were a lot different that day. "We walked off the park losing the match and each of the players knew that we needed to step it up next time we'd take on Blacktown. "We exploited a few areas of the Demons today but I believe big moments win big games and that's what we did today. "I thought our defence was superb, we moved the ball well in the midfield and Cattanach's finishing was terrific."

A subdued Genc was pretty philosophical about the match and had some stern words to say about his side.

"We played poorly, certain players failed to show up on the pitch. "That wasn't the real Blacktown you saw today and I am quietly confident you won't be seeing a repeat of what happened today in the next three weeks. "Full credit to Manly though they played well and I wish them luck in the final against Wollongong."

The Demons coach, who is putting an extra training session this week, is hoping that his side can snap out of this sudden phase they hit against Manly.

"I hope the players do wake up and snap out of it. "Winning the competition is our main objective and we will remain focused on the job at hand starting with Manly this week where we will be a totally different squad."

## Harry Kewell in central role

Socceroos star Harry Kewell has given a rousing thumbs-up to coach Graham Arnold's plans to play him as a central striker during next month's Asian Cup.

Socceroos coach Arnold announced last week that he planned shifting Kewell to play just behind spearhead Mark Viduka to boost Australia's goal-scoring power for the tournament.

The Liverpool star more regularly plays as a left-sided midfielder but said he relished the chance for a more central role when the Socceroos kicked off their Asian Cup campaign against Oman in Bangkok on July 8.

"It's one of my favourite positions, I won't deny that, and I'm quite sure a lot of players love that position because it's a main position," Kewell said in Canberra.

"He's (Arnold) said that's obviously a formation that we can play. A lot of managers say that about a lot of teams and a lot of players.

"Once we know our opponents, once we sit down and we study them a little bit more we'll know the formations to play and if I am to play up front or behind or left side that's fantastic, I mean I just want to be playing."

The last time Kewell pulled on the green and gold was June 22 last year when Australia drew with Croatia at the World Cup, scoring a late equaliser which put the Socceroos into the round of 16.

He has since endured a frustrating 11 months out of competitive football with foot and groin injuries which required surgery, only returning in time to play in Liverpool's final two English Premier League games.

Kewell also played the last 30 minutes of the club's 2-1 defeat to AC Milan in May's European Champions League final.

Throughout his stint on the sidelines, Kewell said he maintained a training regime with the club and has declared himself 100 per cent fit.

"Up to ... six months I've been working and I've been training with the team up to four months doing full training sessions training with the team," he said.

"I'm one hundred per cent fit now, I've taken 11 months off to recoup with all my injuries ... but I'm fully fit now and I'm raring to go."

"I can't wait (to play for Australia). It's been a long time since the last game which was against Croatia.

"I'm really looking forward to meeting up with the boys and getting this tournament off to a good start."

Kewell and his team mates start arriving in Singapore from Thursday for a pre-Asian Cup training camp, which will include a friendly against Singapore on June 30.

## Why Australia belongs to Asia

Asian Football Confederation (AFC) president Mohamed bin Hammam has dispelled any talk that Australia faces an uncertain future in Asia.

"Australia is a valued member of our confederation and it is here to stay," Bin Hamman declared three weeks before the start of the AFC Asian Cup and to suggest otherwise is absolute rubbish and not worth even talking about."

Bin Hammam and Football Federation Australia (FFA) chairman Frank Lowy were the driving force behind the move that took ambitious Australia away from the football backwater of Oceania to the world's most populous region in 2005.

Kuwait Olympic Committee chairman Sheik Talah al Fahd Al Sabah caused a stir late last year when he blasted the AFC's decision to give Australia the chance to marry into the Asian family.

"This is the biggest mistake made against Asian soccer. This will kill Asia's ambitions," he was quoted as saying.

"But it is natural to be able to change the AFC decision. A general assembly can annul it the way it approved it."

Voices of discontent emanating from the Gulf area - Kuwait missed out on a place in the Asian Cup after falling to Australia in the qualifiers - won't go away but the AFC supremo sought to reassure the Australians that their long-term future in Asia was safe.

"Yes, it's true that some people are against the concept of Australia being an AFC member and, yes, I know these complaints are coming mostly from west Asia," Bin Hammam conceded.

"But they are a small minority and do not reflect the general attitude of the majority of Asian nations, who are very positive about the whole thing.

"The technical standard Australia brings to Asian football is invaluable and the stories about Australia being voted out as quickly as they were voted in are...well...so ridiculous I do not even want to talk about them.

"What the people who are making all these noises should do is actually get to our congresses and see for themselves the overwhelming support within the AFC for the Australians."

Bin Hammam said he thought the reason some countries were complaining was because Australia's entry to the AFC would more than likely rob traditional Asia of a spot in the World Cup.

"I can understand their concern but they should look at what expertise Australia is bringing to Asian football," he said. "All this vindicates our decision to invite them to join us."

The AFC freely admits that having a major tournament in four countries was a mistake.

"Not so much because we have had to deal with four governments and four organising committees but because we gave ourselves only three years to prepare from one Asian Cup to the next. It has been difficult."

The AFC has decided to stage its most important tournament - that is held every four years - in a non-World Cup or European Championship year in a bid to maximise interest.

Which means the scheduled 2008 tournament had to be brought forward to this year.

The AFC expects the Australian national team to be followed by large numbers wherever they play.

The Socceroos are in Bangkok-based Group A with Oman, Iraq and Thailand and the presence of such high-profile Premier League stars as Mark Viduka, Harry Kewell, Tim Cahill, Lucas Neill and Mark Schwarzer will ensure healthy gates for their three group matches. The other groups are in Hanoi, Kuala Lumpur and Jakarta.

"Fans in most parts of south-east Asia are of the traditional type and not accustomed to pre-paid tickets," Bin Hammam said.

"They would much rather buy their tickets on match day at the gate. So ticket sales are a bit slow.

"But Bangkok is different. Sales are going well thanks largely to a more professional ticketing system in Thailand and of course the extra attraction of the Australians."

## Melbourne Victory want Patafta

A-League champions Melbourne Victory look set to sign one of Australia's most promising talents from one of Europe's biggest clubs on a loan deal.

Teenage midfielder Kaz Patafta, who has spent the past 18 months at Portuguese giant Benfica, is expected to head back to Australia to join the Victory for the upcoming season.

Patafta, 18, captained Australia's U17 side at the 2005 World Championship and was a training partner with the Socceroos' World Cup squad last year.

The Victory declined to comment on whether the club had signed Patafta, but Portuguese newspaper Record and Portuguese television quoted Benfica as saying they had agreed a 50,000 euro (\$A75,000) loan deal with the Victory for Patafta.

A diminutive attacking midfielder who stands around 170cm, Patafta would add to the Victory's impressive list of off-season signings including Costa Rican international Carlos Hernandez and Socceroos centre-back Ljubo Milicevic.

Originally from Canberra, Patafta is an Australian Institute of Sport graduate but was overlooked by A-League clubs in the lead-up to the first season of the competition.

Instead he ended up securing a dream move to Benfica, playing mainly youth team football this season for a club which took part in the European Champions League and finished third in the Portuguese Liga.

Patafta first came to prominence when he caught the eye of then-Socceroos coach Guus Hiddink with his Joeys performances.

Hiddink selected him as a training partner for the senior side ahead of both the World Cup qualifier against Uruguay in late 2005, and in both the Netherlands and Germany ahead of last the 2006 World Cup finals.

So impressed was Hiddink that the youngster was linked with a move to Hiddink's Dutch club PSV Eindhoven before the coach quit to take up full-time coaching duties with Russia.

The Victory are expected to enter the A-League season with a 21-man roster, leaving them just two more vacancies in their squad.

Victory coach Ernie Merrick has confirmed the club wants an experienced back-up striker to cover for Socceroos Archie Thompson and Danny Allsopp, as well as a younger player to round out the squad.

## Owen - Viduka backed to fire

Former England skipper Alan Shearer believes Socceroos star Mark Viduka can form one of the Premier League finest strike partnerships with Michael Owen at Newcastle next season.

Shearer expects Owen to remain at St James' Park despite continuing speculation over the 27-year-old's future.

And the Newcastle legend is adamant Owen and the club's new signing, Viduka, will form a strike-force difficult to contain.

"I think (Owen) playing up front with Mark Viduka will be a great partnership for United," Shearer said.

"Viduka is great at holding the ball up and we all know how great Michael is at scoring goals.

"So I don't think there will be many better partnerships out there in the Premiership next season than the one at St James' Park."

England international Owen is yet to reveal his plans for next season amid suggestions he could leave Newcastle under a release clause in his contract after two injury-hit seasons with the club.

However, former England team mate Shearer, who played a key role in persuading the then Real Madrid front man to make his switch to Newcastle in 2005, believes he will remain at the club.

"I am sure there are lots of people who want to ask me whether I think Michael Owen will be at Newcastle next season," Shearer said.

"To be honest, I don't think anyone would be prepared to pay STG10 million (\$A23.55 million) or STG11 million (\$A25.9 million) for him until they have seen him play for five or six months.

"So if anyone says to me, will he be here next season? I would have to say yes, I think he will be."

Owen has played just 14 games and scored seven goals for the Magpies since arriving on Tyneside.

A fractured metatarsal and then knee injury suffered at the 2006 World Cup has drastically limiting his involvement.
