NSW Premier League

Manly United FC 2
Blacktown City 4

In a tumultuous finale to the Preliminary Final it took an exceptional performance from a quality football team as Blacktown City made their way into the 2007 Telechoice Championship Series Premier League Grand Final.

Down 2-0 midway through the second half and 2-1 with just two minutes remaining, the Premiers staged a Lazarus-like comeback to force the match into extra-time before prevailing 4-2.

"It was a fantastic effort and one which shows the real character of this side," said Blacktown City coach AYTEK GENC. "There were times in this game that we appeared down and out yet these guys toughed it out and never gave in."

After starting the game off in fourth gear it was Manly who set a platform for an unlikely win with two goals in the first hour of the match. After beating Demons defender Tayfun Devrimol down the left hand side, Joey Schirripa delivered a pinpoint cross to Michael Lloyd-Green for goal number one ten minutes before the half-time break.

Fifteen minutes into the second stanza Robbie Cattanach had his near post effort turned into the goal by Demons defender Mirko Jurilj and all of a sudden the Premiers were looking anything but good things to make a back-to-back Grand Final appearance.

Down 2-0 and looking like they were on their way out, the Demons lifted themselves from the canvas as man-of-the-match Milorad Simonovic scored a 71st minute scorcher from the edge of the penalty box. With just two minutes of the game remaining, Roberto Hamad earned a red card for his challenge on Adam Biddle and up stepped midfielder Leo Carle to convert the penalty.

It was an unbelievable comeback for the Demons whose fans buoyed by their sides resurgence lifted the roof off Fairfax Community Stadium as they attempted to bring their side home.

With the game in extra-time, the Demons really upped the ante as Tolgay Ozbey scored his sides third from a defensive error and Simonovic put the nail in the Manly coffin with his second in traffic.

United' disappointing end to the match compounded as Pascal Julliard received his marching orders for a second yellow card and substitute Brad Groves a straight red for a post match verbal tirade.

"It was a magnificent performance from a very courageous football team," said Manly United F.C. coach Phil Moss. "We really put Manly on the map this season and I am very proud for the way we played. Obviously we are disappointed with some decisions that went against us but when the disappointment of the day wanes I am sure we will look back on this match with pride."

The controversy for Manly fans was the key dismissal of Hamad with just two minutes of the match remaining. Hamad was adjudged by referee Jonathan Streater as having lifted his elbow in attempting to dispossess Biddle in a race for a loose ball.

The loss of Hamad and the send off of fellow defender Pascal Julliard souring an otherwise impressive performance by United, who gave it everything despite the result.

"It has been a phenomenal year for the club – a year in which we put Manly on the footballing map," said Moss.

The Demons will meet Bankstown City in next Sundays Telechoice Grand Final at CUA Stadium, Penrith. Yellow cards picked up by Bobby Dragas

and Devrimol will mean these two key defenders will miss the match with suspension.

Kickoff is at 3.00pm.

Once time heals the pain of loss, future is bright

I'VE always been a big believer in all things happening for a reason. For what reason the events of Sunday afternoon's NSW Premier League preliminary final unfolded I have no idea at this stage. But I'm sure down the track it will become evident.

After 88 minutes of Sunday's fantastic final we had one foot in the grand final door. It was a surreal experience to watch from the technical area as first Roberto Hamad and then Pascal Julliard were shown the red card by referee Jonathan Streater.

The overriding emotion for me was pain for the players - the boys have worked so hard since November 1 last year to put Manly United on the map.

They were two minutes from getting their just rewards - a grand final berth. To have it ripped away in such dramatic circumstances was cruel and the boys deserved better.

But once time eases the pain, the positives to come out of season 2007 will be immense.

Young players like Hamad, Julliard, Ash Ryan, Michael Lloyd-Green and Beau Busch announced themselves as genuine first graders this season. Robbie Cattanach recaptured the form we all know he is capable of and was outstanding all season. The team leaders - Richy Williams and Brad Swancott in particular - led the side brilliantly all year. Even the form of reserve goalkeeper Luke Femia in the 20s was great and he kept pressure on "Swanny" all year.

It was a fantastic squad effort this year and the club is in great shape moving forward.

The outstanding team highlights included the 2-1 victory over Marconi away that kept our finals hopes alive, the Tiger Turf Cup semi-final 4-1 win over Blacktown, the last day of the regular season against Apia away that booked our first Top Four spot at this level and the minor semi-final victory over Marconi.

From a coaching perspective, seeing the form of youngsters Hamad, Julliard, Busch and Ryan and the rejuvenation of Cattanach was very satisfying. I have to give credit to the Manly United board and general manager Jeremy Toivonen for an open-mind approach and willingness to try new things.

Dee Why a part of league's new order

DEE WHY'S upset 1-0 win over Brookvale did more than just shake up the battle for finals spots in the Manly Warringah Premier League - it boosted Telstra activity as well.

With regular coach Jonny Whelan on holiday in England, a brave Dee Why outfit knocked off perennial competition powerhouses Brookvale in an entertaining affair.

When the full-time whistle sounded club president Michael LeHanie, who has also taken on board the coaching duties, was on the phone to Whelan telling him of the result.

"He was pretty stoked to hear about the game obviously," LeHanie told The Manly Daily.

"I got a couple of calls from the other clubs congratulating me as well. Narrabeen have moved to the top now (because of this result) and they're were certainly on the phone congratulating us."

The win all but assures Dee Why's position in the Premier League next season, extending their lead over last-placed Harbord to six points.

The game itself contained many nerve-wracking moments for Dee Why.

"During the week we concentrated on setting up a back four that wouldn't concede goals," LeHanie continued.

"We'd given away too many silly goals and early goals."

The caretaker coach must have been horrified while watching his side concede two penalties, but his fears were allayed by man of the match goalkeeper Jamie Kukuron who saved one spot kick and watched as the other was pushed wide. Then with 15 to go rookie midfielder Jason Cohen slotted home calmly to make sure the text messages would be flying around later on that evening.

Harbord's 5-2 loss to Wakehurst moves them one step closer to relegation, while Pittwater's poor run continued with a 1-0 loss to Mosman. Manly Vale went down 3-1 to CC Strikers, Narrabeen moved into top spot with 5-0 thrashing of Forest and Beacon Hill snuck home 1-0 against BTH Raiders.

EXCLUSIVE: Aussies anger AFC

Football Federation Australia (FFA) was warned it could be charged with bringing the AFC Asian Cup in to disrepute after Graham Arnold's strong comments during the tournament.

The Australian national team coach declared at the end of Australia's drawn match with Oman in its opener in Bangkok: 'Welcome to Asia' after being asked to discuss the Gulf team's spoiling tactics in a 1-1 draw.

AFC president Mohamed bin Hammam was so incensed with this and other comments coming from the Australian camp that he informed the FFA that it would be charged with bringing the tournament in to disrepute if such behaviour persisted.

The perceived inference was that Asian teams were a bunch of cheats.

"Arnold's comments were disrespectful not only to the AFC but to the other participating teams," an AFC source said. "Australia must remember it is a part of Asia."

Bin Hammam even told a packed press conference on the morning of the final in Jakarta that he thought 'Australia will have learned a few things in its first Asian Cup' especially the need 'to show more respect to opponents'.

FFA chairman Frank Lowy, who worked so tirelessly to make the Asian Football Confederation accept Australia in to Asia's football family, is understood to be greatly disturbed by the incident.

Chief executive Ben Buckley said the FFA was conducting a special investigation in to the matter and Australia's ill-fated Asian Cup debut.

"We will review everything, from our preparation, how we performed on the field, how we conducted ourselves and how we approached the media," he said.

"From the inquiry that I will chair we should build recommendations on how to approach Asian tournaments."

"But it is important to remember that our so-called unacceptable behaviour was not isolated."

"The Korean coach had to escort off the field by police after being sent off and there were other antics that we in Australia would regard as unsporting."

"I am not trying to defend ourselves. We certainly must learn to adapt to Asian cultures and sensitivities. What might pass as an innocent remark could be seen as offensive in other parts of the world."

"We must make sure that our coaches and players are aware of this when they represent Australia in Asia."

Arnold was unavailable for comment.

FFA in touch with Vieira

Asian Cup-winning coach Jorvan Vieira has confirmed he has been approached by Australian football officials over the Socceroos coaching job.

The Brazilian spoke with representatives from both Australia and Korea Republic on the phone less than 24 hours after guiding Iraq to their fairytale 1-0 victory over Saudi Arabia in the final of the Asian Cup in Jakarta on Sunday.

He is reportedly set to arrive in Sydney next month for discussions with Football Federation Australia.

"I spoke on the telephone with representatives of Australia and South Korea asking me if I was interested," Vieira told Reuters during a brief stopover in Bangkok.

"It's still very early. First, I need a holiday before I decide what to do."

After taking control of the Iraq national team just two months before the Asian Cup, Vieira quit only hours after the final, citing the unsettled nature of the Iraq football administration.

Socceroos coach Graham Arnold is expected to be stood down from the role following Australia's quarter-final exit at the Cup, but has been offered a three-year deal to stay with the FFA as a staff coach, where he will likely resume duties with the Olyroos.

The Moroccan national team is also believed to be chasing Vieira, as well as several clubs, but the 54-year-old insists he is only interested in a national team job.

"Clubs are already preparing for their season, I would have to wait months before I can make any impact and there would be too many problems," Vieira said.

"With a national team, I have time to work, get to know the players and prepare to get the right system and right team."

Korea are searching for a new coach after Dutchman Pim Verbeek - a former assistant of Guus Hiddink - quit following his side's third-place finish at the Asian Cup.

Dutchman Dick Advocaat is still believed to be the frontrunner for the Socceroos job, although Verbeek may also be considered.

The FFA is expected to begin their review of the Asian Cup soon, with the head coaching job likely to be a top priority as the Socceroos begin planning for their 2010 World Cup qualifiers, starting next year.

Vieira was an assistant coach with Morocco during the 1986 World Cup when they reached the second round as group winners ahead of England, Portugal and Poland.

He said he had also received job offers from clubs in Turkey, Saudi Arabia, Korea Republic and Brazilian team Vasco Da Gama, for whom he played in the 1970s.

Youthful edge to Matildas

Australia's womens team will field a youthful line-up in their penultimate Beijing Olympic qualifying match in Hong Kong on Sunday 4 August.

The Matildas hope of qualification were effectively dashed after successive losses against DPR Korea in July left the Matildas six points adrift with two matches remaining.

The Australian squad for the Hong Kong match will comprise players likely to feature in the Young Matildas team who will compete in October's AFC U-19 Women's Championship where a berth at the 2008 FIFA U-20 Women's World Cup will be on the line.

The Matildas face a heavy schedule in August commencing in camp on August 9 with the final Beijing Olympic qualifier against Chinese Taipei in Coffs Harbour on August 12.

The team will then travel to Tianjin for matches against China on August 16 and 19 in what will be the last international matches prior to the FIFA Women's World Cup.

The team will commence their World Cup journey when they travel to China on September 5 at the conclusion of a four-day camp in Sydney.

Australia will open their campaign at the World Cup against Ghana on September 12 in Hangzhou. The Matildas will then meet world number four ranked team Norway on September 15 in the same city,

before the final group match against Canada on September 19 in Chengdu.

Popovic named skipper

Sydney FC has appointed former Socceroos defender Tony Popovic as its club captain.

Popovic, who joined the A-League club last month after a spell in Qatar with Al Arabi, replaces fellow defender Mark Rudan as the club's skipper.

"It's a privilege to be named captain of Sydney FC. The club has been lucky to have such a superb leader in Mark for the first two A-League campaigns and I'm looking forward to working with him and the club's other senior players in the leadership group," Popovic said.

Sydney FC coach Branko Culina said he believes Popovic's signing 'heralds a new era for the club'.

"Mark (Rudan) has done splendidly over the past two seasons and will remain an important member of Sydney FC's leadership group," Culina said.

"But (Popovic has been) a terrific leader ever since he captained Sydney United at the age of just 21."

Juninho to arrive on Friday

World Cup winning midfielder Juninho is set to join Sydney FC as the A-League's side marquee player next season.

The 34-year-old former Middlesbrough, Celtic and Atletico Madrid playmaker, who was recently close to moving to Championship outfit Hull City, is expected to arrive in Australia on Friday to complete the deal.

Sydney have been linked with Phillip Cocu, Robbie Fowler, Jay Jay Okocha, Jimmy Floyd Hasselbaink and Australia striker John Aloisi following Dwight Yorke's departure last year.

Chief executive George Perry refused to comment on the deal, but admitted the club were in negotiations with several players and were closing in on securing at least one signature.

But Sydney playmaker Steve Corica admits he is excited by the prospect of playing alongside the diminutive Brazilian.

"The club hasn't told us anything official, but if he is coming it's great news," he said.

"He is obviously a quality player and a player people will come to watch."

"He doesn't have the same profile Dwight had off the field, but he has played for Brazil and at the highest level in England so he'd be a drawcard for sure."

"It would be great to be able to play with someone like him."

Injury worry for Cahill

Tim Cahill will see a consultant to assess the results of an earlier X-ray on his damaged foot amid fears that the injury is worse than at first thought.

The Everton midfielder has been recovering from a broken metatarsal, suffered at Sheffield United in March.

And in his first game back for the Toffees against Werder Bremen he was taken off after 61 minutes after falling awkwardly - the worry being that he had damaged the same foot again.

Cahill had an X-ray earlier before Everton announced on their website, www.evertonfc.com, that he was being referred to a specialist. The club are unlikely to make any further comment at the moment.

If Cahill has suffered a recurrence of the injury, it could put him out for a couple of months, at least - a savage blow to the Australian and the Merseysiders.

Everton's assistant manager Alan Irvine was considered with his view on Cahill after the 2-2 draw with the Germans.

He said: "He felt his foot again which obviously is a bit of a worry. He landed on it awkwardly which probably frightened him a little."

Everton have been concerned over Cahill's recovery, particularly because of the pressures put on him to play for Australia in the Asia Cup.

Cahill was included in the Australia squad after Everton's medical experts flew out to examine their player.

But the 28-year-old was frequently used only as a substitute in the tournament and did not play a full part in the event.

He returned to Everton last week to start training again, and did not travel out to the USA for a training camp in Los Angeles with the club again showing concerns about his fitness.

Everton boss David Moyes will be praying for better news from the specialists than is feared.

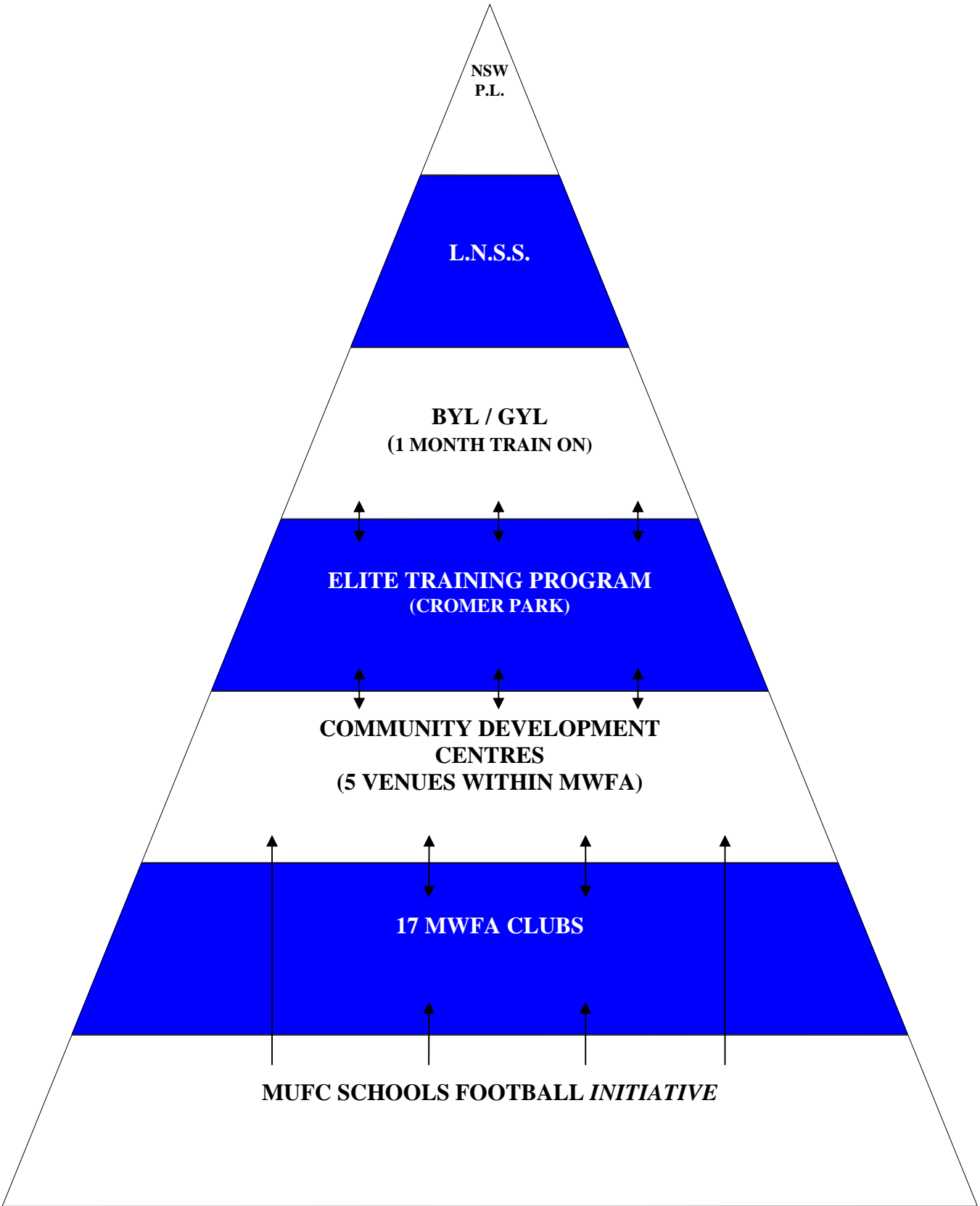
